CLASS 39 - WAGYU CHALLENGE

SPECIAL CONDITIONS - CLASS 39

Entry:

1. This competition is only open to Wagyu and Wagyu-cross cattle (minimum 50% Wagyu blood).

2. Applications to enter close at 5.00pm on Friday 20 April 2018.

3. Entry Fees per pen:

	Online	Non Online
RNA Member	\$195.00	\$200.00
RNA non-member	\$215.00	\$220.00

4. This competition is strictly limited to 259 animals (37 pens). Maximum of three entries/pens per exhibitor. If entries exceed the maximum number of entries then Exhibitors with multiple entries may be asked to reduce their numbers.

5. All entries to consist of a pen of 7 steers, with the best 6 being judged in the competition. If for any reason there are less than 6 head at the time of judging, the entry will be disqualified.

6. Exhibitors with multiple entries are requested to clearly identify individual pens if they are to be drafted into particular groups.

Weight Gain Competition:

7. The Feedlot Competition will take place at Mort & Co's Grassdale Feedlot, Dalby.

8. Exhibitors to arrange transport to the feedlot, or alternatively Mort & Co will contact exhibitors to coordinate freight from central pick up locations through Farmhaul at a cost to be advised.

9. Exhibits in Class 39 will spend 21 days in dedicated preconditioning paddocks to ensure shrink and curfew variability is minimised. Commencement weight for the

competition will follow preconditioning. 4% will be deducted from this weight to allow for shrinkage, as applied in normal feedlot applications.

10. **ALL CATTLE MUST BE CLEAR OF TICKS.** All stock from Cattle Tick Infected Areas must receive a supervised inspection and a plunge dip under the supervision of an approved person at an official clearing facility. Cattle must commence travel to the feedlot within 24 hours of treatment.

11. The 2019 Paddock to Palate Field Day and announcement of the Feedlot trial winners will be on Tuesday 18 June 2019 at Grassdale Feedlot, Dalby.

Carcass Competition:

13. All carcasses will be sold to Mort & Co Ltd.

14. Carcasses will be judged on AUS-MEAT chiller assessment and Japanese digital camera technology. Only one side is chiller assessed and this score is applied to the body.

15. Carcasses will be disqualified for being under/overweight and having more than 8 teeth,.

Carcass Value:

16. The carcass value will be determined by HSCW against a Camera MarblingScore (0-9 Grid price determined in 2019).

Taste Off:

17. A striploin shall be taken from the highest scoring carcass in each pen of 7 after AUS-MEAT chiller assessment to compete in the Beef Taste-Off. The RNA appreciates the assistance of QDAF Food Scientists for the conduct of the Beef taste Off Competition.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS - CLASS 39

1. IDEAL ENTRY WEIGHT OF STEERS IS 330kg to 400kg (guide only). Please pay special attention to this weight range to minimise the chances of disqualification in the carcass competition.
2. All steers must be 0-2 tooth upon entry and HGP free.
3. All steers must be delivered on Wednesday 16 May or before 12 noon Thursday 17 May 2018. It is mandatory that all steers arrive by Thursday 17 May 2018, as all animals need to be inducted prior to paddocking. Any steers arriving after Thursday 16 May will be disqualified and unable to participate in the competition.
4. Key dates for the feedlot competition:
Induction will take place on Thursday 17 May 2018 followed by paddocking, Feedlot entry Thursday 7 June 2018, Final Weigh Monday 10 June 2019, Processing Friday 21 June 2019.
5. All cattle will be processed at 400 days on feed including time spent in the preconditioning paddocks (21 days).
