Today, 28 breeds and an average of 1,600 head of beef cattle compete in Australia's largest annual cattle competition known as Ekka Beef Week from August 7. Judging takes place across stud beef, led steer and prime beef. The stud beef competition attracts th00 entries alone the largest showing of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere.

The cream of the dairy industry gather annually at Ekka, for one of the largest showings of dairy cattle in Australia. About 250 head of cattle compete in the competition which showcases six breeds -Ayrshire, Guernsey, Illawarra, Jersey, Holstein and Brown Swiss. The cows compete on the quality of their milk and a highlight is the Supreme Dairy



Horses have been competing at Ekka since the very first show in 1876, when silver cups were awarded to the best stallion and best heavy draught stallion.

Today, the Horse Competition attracts an average of 2,400 entries, making it one of the largest Ekka competitions. More than 15 breeds of horses are displayed over the four competition sections -Horse, Thoroughbred, Showjumping and Farriers and Blacksmiths.

Ekka guests, especially the kids, will love getting up close to more than 550 farmyard animals on their adventure through the nursery. They'll get to feed, pat and interact with all of their favourites including calves, lambs, ducklings and goats. The RACQ Animal Nursery provides the perfect opportunity for kids to interact with farmyard animals they don't normally see in their everyday lives.

Pat-a-pig (0-10)

Teeny, tiny and utterly adorable piglets can be found at the popular Pat-A-Pig display in the RACQ Animal Nursery. Now in its third year, children and families of all ages will love cuddling and playing with these charming little creatures.
