Thank you for entering the 2019 Royal Queensland Show (Ekka).

This year, the RNA is proud to be housing exhibits from a range of competition sections under one roof - the Arrow Energy Pavilion.

This is the first time all four storeys of the pavilion will be used to house animals at the Ekka - including yours.

Last year, the pavilion, which is part of the \$2.9 billion Brisbane Showgrounds Regeneration Project, opened with the ground and first floors in use for the show, housing stud beef and dairy cattle, dairy goats and poultry.

Joining them in the Arrow Energy Pavilion this year will be sheep, angoras and alpacas. This brings the total number of animals housed in the pavilion to more than 2,500.

The Arrow Energy Pavilion is the only building of its kind in the world, specially designed to house these animals during Ekka and act as an events space and car park facility outside of show - with all revenue invested back into the show.

We have produced this special guide for exhibitors housing animals in the Arrow Energy Pavilion, to enhance your showing experience by ensuring you stay well informed.

This comprehensive guide features essential information such as key contacts, maps, preparation tips, arrival details, the process for staying in the Arrow Energy Farmers Village and a competition overview. It is available for download at www.ekka.com.au and will be updated regularly.

The running of the Arrow Energy Pavilion will be overseen by the Superintendent and their support staff. The Arrow Energy Pavilion reception opening hours are as follows.



OVERVIEW OF THE ARROW ENERGY PAVILION

To assist with the operation of the Arrow Energy Pavilion, each floor has been colour coded.

These colours will be particularly useful during the Bump In / Bump Out process for each of the competitions.



Public Open Hours

The Arrow Energy Pavilion will be open to the general public between 9am to 6pm each day. Outside of these hours, security will be present.

PRIOR TO ARRIVAL TIPS

Familiarise yourself with this guide

It's important you please take the time to read this information guide thoroughly.

There are a lot of changes this year, particularly in relation to the location of competitions, stalling and accommodation.

We are providing exhibitors with this detailed information to help you plan your stay at Ekka and to ensure the smooth running of the Arrow Energy Pavilion.

Vehicle Access Pass and Gate Entry

All exhibitors requiring vehicle access to the Arrow Energy Pavilion will need a vehicle access permit.

To apply for your permit please visit <u>www.ekka.com.au/leasing/vehicle-access-request</u>

Access to the Arrow Energy Pavilion is via Gate 5 off O'Connell Terrace.

The permit must be displayed on your vehicle dashboard in order to gain access to the Brisbane Showgrounds.

Online Exhibitor Induction

It is a workplace health and safety requirement that <u>every</u> exhibitor who either has animals at the Brisbane Showgrounds and/or is staying on ground must complete an induction.

This ensures compliance with Queensland fire and safety regulations.

If you do not complete your induction online prior to arriving at the Showgrounds, you will be required to watch the induction course and complete the questions onsite.

Exhibitors will not be able to receive keys to their accommodation without completing the induction.

Therefore it is strongly recommended that all exhibitors complete the online induction prior to their arrival at the Showgrounds.

Purchase Truck / Car Parking at Andrew's Airport Parking

If you would like to park a truck/car at Andrew's Airport Parking, you are required to have pre-purchased parking.

This can be done via the Competition Entry System at https://entries.royalqueenslandshow.com.au/Account/ ExhibitorLogin

National Vendor Declaration Forms (stud beef and dairy cattle only)

National Vendor Declaration Forms (NVD's) are to be submitted to the Accredited Certifier on arrival at the loading dock before going to the Arrow Energy Pavilion reception for your stall and accommodation allocations.

Please note, different/separate NVD's are required for stud beef and led steer even if for the same exhibitor.

Prepare Treatment Form (if required)

Exhibits that are under treatment on arrival must have treatment sheets submitted to the Arrow Energy Pavilion reception within 12 hours of arrival.

Scheduled pharmaceuticals must have authorisation of the prescribing Veterinary Surgeon.

Pharmaceuticals prescribed should be clearly labelled to assist with the assessment.

Treatment forms can be downloaded from the respective competition pages on the Ekka website

ARRIVAL PROCESS

Movement of Hay and Gear

Exhibitors will receive colour coded tags (based on level - see page 7) for movement of hay and gear (see Step 7 above), that can be placed on gear and hay for transport to allocated stalling.

Exhibitors are encouraged to palletise (where practical) hay for quicker movement.

Up to six forklifts will be available, depending on the date and time of your arrival. Each forklift will have a spotter/labour along with a driver to assist exhibitors with bump in.

A variety of cages and pallets will be on hand to move exhibitors' gear.

To help assist us with a smooth bump in, please ensure vehicles do not remain on the loading dock for extended periods of time. Hay and gear will need to be dropped off in a timely fashion.



Tip - palletise hay and gear if you're able to.

Gear for Accommodation Area

The majority of accommodation for exhibitors will be located on the roof of the Arrow Energy Pavilion.

Your gear will be moved to your animal stalling location, and from there the movement of gear to the roof will be your responsibility.

A range of trolleys will be available to use (with a security deposit) from the Arrow Energy Pavilion reception, to assist in moving gear to the accommodation area.

Animal Drop Off

It is important animals are moved to stalling in a timely fashion and trucks are moved from the loading dock, to help reduce any potential bottlenecks.

It would be appreciated if exhibitors could please adhere to this and seek assistance if required.

ONSITE ACCOMMODATION - ARROW ENERGY FARMERS VILLAGE

Location – Level 4 (Roof) – Arrow Energy Pavilion

Accommodation associated with competitions in the Arrow Energy Pavilion, will largely be located on the roof (Level 4) in the Arrow Energy Farmers Village.

The village has been designed to provide suitable accommodation and facilities for exhibitors showing animals at the Ekka.

Most of the accommodation in the village are four bed dongas.

Due to the limited availability of accommodation onsite, there is NO guarantee you will be allocated a donga with vacant beds.

If you do not wish to share accommodation with other exhibitors, you may want to consider alternative accommodation options.

No Induction = No Key

All onsite accommodation at the Brisbane Showgrounds must be pre-booked prior to arrival.

Anyone staying onsite must complete an induction (to comply with workplace health and safety requirements) prior to accommodation keys being handed over.

All exhibitors are encouraged to complete the online induction course prior to arrival to speed up the key allocation process.

Exhibitors who do not complete the online induction prior to arrival will be required to watch an induction video and answer a number of questions before being provided with accommodation.

Wrist Bands

All inducted exhibitors will be provided with a wrist band that will allow them to:

- Access the Arrow Energy Farmers Village
- Access the Brisbane Showgrounds

The wrist band provided will depend on the competition you are involved in.

Different colour wrist bands will be valid for different time periods, both for access to the Showgrounds and to the Arrow Energy Farmers Village.

Security

To ensure the safety of exhibitors, security will be present within the Arrow Energy Farmers Village 24 hours a day.

Only people with valid wrist bands will be allowed into the village.

Facilities Provided within the Arrow Energy Farmers Village

To assist exhibitors with their planning, below is a guide as to what is and isn't provided in the village.

What Is Provided	What Isn't Provided
Bunk beds with mattress in temporary donga (room sizes – 4 or 8 beds)	Sheets / pillows / blankets
Communal cooking facilities (with microwaves)	Cooking utensils or pots
BBQ's with gas	Tableware
Cold / freezer room (with shelves) Tip - Bring lockable tubs for food storage	Towels and toiletries
Toilet and shower block (separate male and female blocks)	Lockers
Running water with a sink	Cleaning products or equipment
Covered area (marquee) with tables and chairs	Laundry facilities

Given the amount of gear to move in and out of the Arrow Energy Pavilion, exhibitors are encouraged to use the cold rooms provided. Fridges will not be moved to the village.

You are encouraged to bring a lockable box to place your food in, if you are concerned about the security of your food in the cold rooms.

Accommodation Rules

To ensure the comfort of all exhibitors staying in the Arrow Energy Farmers Village, the following rules are in place to adhere to.

- 1. Do not interfere with the reasonable peace, comfort, and privacy of others.
- 2. Illegal substances will not be tolerated and offenders will be reported to the police.
- 3. Please keep noise at an acceptable level as not to disturb other exhibitors or to create noise pollution.
- 4. Parties and smoking within the village will not be tolerated.
- 5. Drunk/disorderly behaviour is unacceptable.
- 6. AT NO TIME are exhibitors permitted to become abusive, verbally or physically, with any other person in order to resolve a dispute. Disputes must be reported to the Arrow Energy Pavilion Superintendent who will attempt a resolution between all exhibitors involved, before passing it on to the relevant authorities.
- 7. Do not tamper with, touch or remove batteries or any other part of the smoke alarm in your room. If this is ignored and results in fire services attending the property due to a false alarm, you will need to pay the bill.
- 8. Bathrooms must be left free of excess water on the floor or vanity areas.
- 9. All beds and mattresses must remain in the allocated donga. They are not to be removed at any time.
- 10. Rooms must be left in a clean and tidy manner when departing.
- 11. Do not bring BBQ's, butane cookers or other gas appliances on site as they are considered a fire hazard
- 12. Please do not bring glass items into the accommodation area

Book in and Book Out Times

To ensure accommodation is available to exhibitors arriving at the Ekka, the following book in and book out times must be adhered to.

Please note, due to the limited number of beds there is no guarantee that additional nights will be available.

Key Deposits

Each exhibitor is required to pay a key deposit of \$20 at the Arrow Energy Pavilion reception located on the first floor of the pavilion.

We encourage exhibitors to pay their key deposits via EPTOS or credit card, for a smooth reimbursement process.

The deposit will be reimbursed after departure, once the key is returned and the room has been inspected and deemed clean and tidy.

Exhibitors whose rooms are not deemed clean and tidy will forfeit their key deposit and may face other charges.

STALLING AREAS

Storage of Gear

Exhibitors are encouraged to bring lockable boxes to store their gear in, particularly valuable items such as blowers and clippers.

Stall Banners

Exhibitors are encouraged to display banners above their pens. It is requested that exhibitors remove their banners as late as possible in their bump out process.

PAVILION STALLING DIMENSIONS



Bedding

A small stockpile of bedding will be located on each floor. Access to replenish this can be coordinated by the Arrow Energy Pavilion Superintendent / reception.

Sleeping in Stalling Areas

It is against fire regulations for exhibitors to sleep in the stalling areas of the Arrow Energy Pavilion. Exhibitors will be able to access a live stream of their stalling.

Details on how to access the live stream will be available from the Arrow Energy Pavilion reception.

No Drilling Please!

Exhibitors are not permitted to drill into the Arrow Energy Pavilion or stalling.

WASTE REMOVAL

Animal Waste

As exhibitors would appreciate, a significant amount of animal waste is produced with the stalling of animals.

Due to the reduced ability of Bobcats to clean out alleyways given the new flooring (to prevent slippage of animals) in the pavilion, the removal of waste is now the responsibility of exhibitors.

Guidelines have been put in place to ensure the areas are kept in a tidy fashion and to ensure the biosecurity and animal welfare.

Each level of the pavilion has a dedicated area for the movement of animal waste, and exhibitors are required to move (wheelbarrow) waste to required points.

LEVEL	LOCATION	EXHIBITOR REQUIREMENT
Ground	Appointed waste point - bottom of the ramp	Dump into small bin
Level 1	Directly to waste bin located on the loading dock	Dump directly into skip bin (open end)
Levels 2 and 3	Appointed waste point - stock pavilion end	Dump in allocated spot, and operator will collect and dispose down waste chute

Tip: Bring wheelbarrow and shovel.

It is VERY IMPORTANT that only animal waste is placed in the dedicated animal waste areas. You will be asked to remove other contaminates. The RNA has a duty to provide clean animal waste to our end user.

General Waste

Exhibitors are asked to use the dedicated bins on each floor for general waste.

Red Lid Bins - General Waste

Yellow Lid Bins - Recyclable Waste

Purple Lid Bins - Cash for Cans / Bottles

Exhibitors are encouraged to place empty cans and bottles into the purple lid bins, for recycling through the Containers for Change Program.

This raises funds for the RNA Foundation (RNAF) - the charitable arm of the RNA. The RNAF raises funds to aid agricultural heritage preservation, agricultural education and agricultural awareness and development.

BIOSECURITY

Strict biosecurity procedures will be implemented during the entry of animals to the pavilion; while the animals are in residence; and when the animals leave.

Exhibitors should ensure that all animal health documents are fully completed and presented to the accredited certifier upon arrival.

Animals will be refused entry if the required documents and health declarations are not presented.

All animals should be inspected at entry by the accredited certifier/steward to ensure they are healthy and have travelled well to the show.

Any animal under current veterinary treatment <u>must</u> be reported upon check in at the Arrow Energy Pavilion reception using the RNA Treatment form, which will be referred to the onsite veterinarians so that they are made aware of the treatment.

During the show, all animals on grounds and in the pavilion will be inspected regularly by the onsite veterinarians and stewards to ensure there are no signs of disease and good animal welfare is being maintained.

On exit from the pavilion, exhibitors will be provided with the correct travel documentation to ensure biosecurity procedures are maintained.

ANIMAL WELFARE

The key objective of the RNA during the housing of/and showing of animals, is to ensure the highest standards of animal welfare at all times.

The Arrow Energy Pavilion Committee was established to ensure appropriate measures were put in place to assess feedback from exhibitors following the 2018 Ekka. The following improvements have been made.

Flooring

Significant testing has been undertaken to improve the floor surface in the pavilion. Based on this testing, rubber floor matting was determined as the most appropriate solution from an animal welfare and biosecurity perspective.

Washing of Animals

Exhibitors are required to wash their animals in the appropriate areas of the ramps.

The areas are dependent on things like Bovine Johnes Disease status.

Clear signage on the wash bay ramps will be displayed.

Exhibitors are asked to comply with these requirements to minimise any biosecurity risks.

Climatic Conditions during the Ekka

The climatic conditions (temperature and humidity) in the pavilion will be monitored throughout the show. Corrective action will be taken to ensure optimal conditions are maintained for the animals. Forecast weather conditions will be assessed each day and steps will be taken by the RNA to alleviate problems which may arise from hot days or windy conditions.

VETERINARY SERVICES

UQ Vets has been assigned to provide veterinarian services for animals in the Arrow Energy Pavilion 24 hours a day.

The phone number for the UQ Vets is 0488 911 244

During the Ekka, exhibitors should report any signs of disease or injury no matter how small to the onsite veterinarians and an assessment will be made on the need for treatment.



A shuttle bus operates between Andrew's Airport Parking and the Brisbane Showgrounds and is included in the cost of parking.


