Dear Exhibitor,

Welcome to 2019 Royal Queensland Show Horse Competition.

Horses have been an Ekka highlight since the very first show in 1876, when the best stallion and best heavy draught stallion were recognised.

Today, the horse competitions attract on average 2,300 entries across four sections - Horse, Thoroughbred, Showjumping and Farriers and Blacksmiths.

More than 15 breeds of horses are showcased over eight days, with the competitions attracting some of the best horses and riders in the country, including those who have competed at the Olympics.

For the very first time, the Horse Competition will also feature five classes for riders with disability, with judging taking place on Sunday 11 August from 8:30am.

The Horse Exhibitor Guide will be back again in 2019, packed with essential competition information.

The comprehensive guide will include highlights, maps, key contacts, judging information, parking and accommodation details and an overview of each of our horse competitions. It is available for download at www.ekka.com.au and will be regularly updated.

Ekka's Fashions on the Field Competition presented by Moët and Chandon will once again run in conjunction with Thoroughbred Day on August 12, which showcases the beauty and versatility of thoroughbred horses.

Offering a new People's Choice Award and 'Springtime Awakens' theme, the Fashions on the Field competition is similar to ones held at race days across the country.

The Ekka is all about showcasing the best of the best our state has to offer and this competition continues to highlight the world-class horsemen and women in Queensland.

I look forward to seeing you all at the 2019 Royal Queensland Show.

PRIOR TO ARRIVAL TIP

Familiarise yourself with this guide

It's important you please take the time to read this information guide thoroughly.

There are a lot of changes this year, particularly in relation to the location of competitions, stalling and accommodation.

We are providing exhibitors with this detailed information to help you plan your stay at Ekka and to ensure the smooth running of the horse competitions.

Vehicle Access Pass and Gate Entry

All exhibitors requiring vehicle access to the Brisbane Showgrounds will need a vehicle access permit.

To apply for your permit please visit www.ekka.com.au/leasing/vehicle-access-request

Access to the Horse Stables is via Gate 4 and exit via Gate 3.

Strictly no vehicle entry via Gate 3 - Horse Exhibitors will be provided with a map and re-directed to Gate 4.

Unloading Gear / Horses

Exhibitors are encouraged to unload their vehicles quickly, and remove them from the grounds to avoid congestion.

The permit must be displayed on your vehicle dashboard in order to gain access to the Brisbane Showgrounds.

Online Exhibitor Induction

It is a workplace health and safety requirement that every exhibitor who either has animals at the Brisbane Showgrounds and/or is staying on ground must complete an induction.

This ensures compliance with Queensland fire and safety regulations.

If you do not complete your induction online prior to arriving at the Showgrounds, you will be required to watch the induction course and complete the questions onsite.

Exhibitors will not be able to receive keys to their accommodation without completing the induction.

Therefore it is strongly recommended that all exhibitors complete the online induction prior to their arrival at the

Showgrounds.

Purchase Truck / Car Parking Managed by Gateway Airport Parking

If you would like parking and transfers to Brisbane Showgrounds managed by Gateway Airport Parking, you are required to have pre-purchased this service.

This can be done via the Competition Entry System at https://entries.royalqueenslandshow.com.au/Account/ ExhibitorLogin

Prepare Treatment Form (if required)

Exhibits that are under treatment on arrival must have treatment sheets submitted to the Horse Superintendents office within 12 hours of arrival.

Scheduled pharmaceuticals must have authorisation of the prescribing Veterinary Surgeon.

Horse Movements

There will be no horse movements in the areas surrounding XXXX Stockmen's Bar and Grill, the Horse Superintendent's office and the entrance to the Main Arena between 5pm-8pm daily, due to the movement of entertainment acts for EkkaNITES supported by RACQ LifeFlight Rescue.

Horse Health and Movement Documentation

Biosecurity Queensland Requirements

The following conditions will apply to stock and vehicles moving onto the Brisbane Showgrounds: Interstate Exhibitors must present the following documents:

- Combined Horse Health Declaration and Waybill
- Interstate Exhibitors crossing at Tweed Heads may have a Queensland Travel Permit
- A separate Horse Health Declaration and Waybill must be supplied every time horses enter the showgrounds.
- Queensland Exhibitors must present the following documents:
 - Queensland Travel Permit, and
 - Combined Horse Health Declaration and Waybill
- Multi Movement Permits can be used to enter the RNA's Grounds.

It is compulsory to complete a combined Horse Health Declaration and Waybill for ALL horses entering the Brisbane Showgrounds. This document must be completed before the commencement of travel to the Brisbane Showgrounds.

Vehicles will be stopped on entry to the Showgrounds and paperwork (Horse Health Declaration/Waybill, travel permit) will need to be shown to the official on the gate and handed to the Horse Superintendent once on the grounds.

No Induction = No Key

All onsite accommodation at the Brisbane Showgrounds must be pre-booked prior to arrival.

Anyone staying onsite must complete an induction (to comply with workplace health and safety requirements) prior to accommodation keys being handed over.

All exhibitors are encouraged to complete the online induction course prior to arrival to speed up the key allocation process.

Exhibitors who do not complete the online induction prior to arrival will be required to watch an induction video and answer a number of questions before being provided with accommodation.

Wrist Bands

All inducted exhibitors will be provided with a wrist band that will allow them access to the Brisbane Showgrounds.

The wrist band provided will depend on the competition you are involved in.

Accommodation Rules

To ensure the comfort of all exhibitors staying at the Brisbane Showgrounds, the following rules are in place to adhere to.

- 1. Do not interfere with the reasonable peace, comfort, and privacy of others.
- 2. Illegal substances will not be tolerated and offenders will be reported to the police.
- 3. Please keep noise at an acceptable level as not to disturb other exhibitors or to create noise pollution.
- 4. Parties and smoking within the village will not be tolerated.
- 5. Drunk/disorderly behaviour is unacceptable.
- 6. AT NO TIME are exhibitors permitted to become abusive, verbally or physically, with any other person in order to resolve a dispute. Disputes must be reported to the Horse Superintendent who will attempt a resolution between all exhibitors involved, before passing it on to the relevant authorities.
- 7. Do not tamper with, touch or remove batteries or any other part of the smoke alarm in your room. If this is ignored and results in fire services attending the property due to a false alarm, you will need to pay the bill.
- 8. Bathrooms must be left free of excess water on the floor or vanity areas.
- 9. All beds and mattresses must remain in the allocated donga. They are not to be removed at any time.
- 10. Rooms must be left in a clean and tidy manner when departing.

Book in and Book Out Times

To ensure accommodation is available to exhibitors arriving at the Ekka, the following book in and book out times must be adhered to.

Please note, due to the limited number of beds there is no guarantee that additional nights will be available.

Key Deposits

Each exhibitor is required to pay a key deposit of \$20 at the Horse Superintendents office.

We encourage exhibitors to pay their key deposits via EPTOS or credit card, for a smooth reimbursement.

The deposit will be reimbursed after departure, once the key is returned and the room has been inspected and deemed clean and tidy.

Exhibitors whose rooms are not deemed clean and tidy will forfeit their key deposit.

WASTE REMOVAL

Animal Waste

As exhibitors would appreciate, a significant amount of animal waste is produced with the stalling of animals. Guidelines have been put in place to ensure the areas are kept in a tidy fashion and to ensure the biosecurity and animal welfare.

The horse stables have a dedicated area for the movement of animal waste, and exhibitors are required to move (wheelbarrow) waste to required points.

Tip - Bring wheelbarrow and shovel

It is VERY IMPORTANT that only animal waste is placed in the dedicated animal waste areas. You will be asked to remove other contaminates. The RNA has a duty to provide clean animal waste to our end user.

General Waste

Exhibitors are asked to use the dedicated bins on each floor for general waste.

Red Lid Bins - General Waste

Yellow Lid Bins - Recyclable Waste

Purple Lid Bins - Cash for Cans / Bottles

Exhibitors are encouraged to place empty cans and bottles into the purple lid bins, for recycling through the Containers for Change Program.

This raises funds for the RNA Foundation (RNAF) - the charitable arm of the RNA.

The RNAF raises funds to aid agricultural heritage preservation, agricultural education and agricultural awareness and development.

BIOSECURITY

Strict biosecurity procedures will be implemented during the entry of animals to the pavilion; while the animals are in residence; and when the animals leave.

Exhibitors should ensure that all animal health documents are fully completed and presented to the biosecurity staff/stewards upon entry.

Animals will be refused entry if the required documents and health declarations are not available.

All animals should be inspected at entry by the biosecurity officer/steward to ensure they are healthy and have travelled well to the show.

Any animal under current veterinary treatment must be reported on check in at the Horse Supers Office using the RNA Treatment form, which will be referred to the onsite veterinarians so that they are made aware of the treatment.

During the show, all animals on grounds and in the pavilion will be inspected regularly by the onsite veterinarians and stewards to ensure there are no signs of disease and good animal welfare is being maintained.

On exit from the pavilion, exhibitors will be provided with the correct travel documentation to ensure biosecurity procedures are maintained.

Hendra Virus Vaccinations

All horse exhibitors MUST have a Hendra vaccination microchip number in order to compete. Horses Vaccinations must be current as listed on the Zoetis Vaccination Registry as at the 1st August 2019. We have taken steps to contact any horse owners with microchip number issues before making decisions to exclude an exhibit from our event due to their Hendra vaccination status on this register. Please ensure you have checked the status of your entry before bringing horses to Ekka. All horses entering the showgrounds will be required to

be microchip scanned through the Measuring Bay before judging commences. Additional random microchip scanning will be conducted throughout the show prior to exhibits entering the Main Arena.

OPENING CEREMONY

The Official Opening Ceremony, which welcomes Ekka guests from across the state, will again be held at midday on Saturday 10 August 2019.

NEW GRAND PARADE TIME

The exhibitor of any exhibit which breaches this regulation will be liable, at the sole discretion of the Horse and Arena Committee, to disqualification from the show, the forfeiture of any prizes, prize money or trophies won and a penalty of \$150.

All orders will be delivered prior to gates opening each day, and must be ordered by 2pm the day prior to guarantee next day delivery.






LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR PARKING

Location

Livestock vehicle parking will be located at 57 Curtin Avenue West, Hamilton and managed by Gateway Airport Parking.

Parking will be available from Friday 2 to Sunday 19 August.



Cost

The cost of parking remains at \$30 per day (inclusive of GST).

Parking MUST be pre-booked prior to arrival at 57 Curtin Avenue West. You can book via the Competition Entry System at https://entries.royalqueenslandshow.com.au/Account/ExhibitorLogin

Please note, a daily audit of vehicles located at 57 Curtin Avenue West will be conducted and fines of \$100 per day will apply to those that have extended past their allocated departure date.

Shuttle Bus

A shuttle bus operated by Gateway Airport Parking between 57 Curtin Avenue West and the Brisbane Showgrounds is included in the cost of parking.

Transfers to and from the Showgrounds operate from 5am to 8pm. The shuttle bus will drop off and collect exhibitors near Gate 4.

OVERVIEW

Horse

The Horse Competitions are among the most exciting events at the Royal Queensland Show and draw some of the largest audiences.

The 2019 Royal Queensland Show Horse Competition will offer a spectacular variety of events and competitions that draw in some of the biggest and most passionate crowds at the show.

For the very first time, the Horse Competition will feature five classes for riders with disability. These will take place on Sunday 11 August from 8:30am.

Showjumping

The Showjumping Competition gets underway on Tuesday 13 August with the Junior Jumping Contest and the Junior Take Your Own Line class. Other highlights include a Holiday Prix on at 1pm on Wednesday 14 August, the fast-paced and exciting Junior Six Bar on Friday 16 August at 4:30pm and the Grand Prix on Sunday 18 August from 2:00pm.

Thoroughbred Day

Thoroughbred Day showcases the beauty and versatility of thoroughbred horses and offers over \$15,000 in cash and prizes, along with the title of Supreme Champion Thoroughbred. It is open to the general public. This is one of Ekka's most glamorous competitions, with men and women wearing formal race attire as they lead their horses into the arena. This competition covers a total of 13 classes - Led and Under Saddle.
