Welcome from the President



Our Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) competitions are the ultimate showcase of the best of the best. They reward and recognise our valued exhibitors for achieving excellence and promote agriculture and the critical role it plays in our everyday lives to Queenslanders.

In 2018, more than 4,125 exhibitors travelled to the Ekka for their chance to win a coveted blue ribbon and share in the \$530,000 prize pool, including 1,186 new competitors.

We received 21,000 entries across 11,000 classes in 48 competition sections, with an increase in entries across many categories including Canine, Cookery, Dairy Goats, Education on Show, Poultry and Farriers and Blacksmiths.

It was pleasing to see large crowds acknowledging the achievements of our exhibitors, with more than 414,000 people attending the 2018 show - our biggest Ekka since 2011.

Some of our competitions were even recognised at the International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) Awards, which represents more than 1,100 fairs around the world. The Ekka won 24 international awards including 16 first places, with the Floristry, Race Around Ekka, Little Sprouts, Cookery and Student Made Cheese competitions all placing.

The RNA is also committed to providing exhibitors with world-class facilities to use, through our \$2.9 billion Brisbane Showgrounds Regeneration Project.

In 2019, our Canine Competition exhibitors will use the new Alexandria Park, offering an undercover area for benching and a grassed area for judging. Also this year, all four storeys of our world first animal pavilion will be in use for the very first time, housing many animals including beef and dairy cattle, poultry and sheep.

For 143 years the RNA has been dedicated to championing agriculture and is honoured to stage Queensland's largest event on behalf of the community each year.

Good luck and we look forward to seeing your entries at the 2019 Royal Queensland Show.

Judging will be performed by a panel of Judges appointed by the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland.

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association, in addition to the Special Regulations which appear in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Competitions Department.

No refunds will be made after close of entry.

NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

Entries for EKKA can be made either on the day or online at our website: <https://entries.royalqueenslandshow.com.au/Account/ExhibitorLogin>. Entries submitted other than on the correct form or online will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with and the forms returned to the office by 5.00pm on the Application to Enter closing date, as shown in the Schedule, they will not be considered.

As a condition for acceptance of my entry: Neither myself nor my family members will indulge in any social, professional or other interaction with an official or judge contracted or sub-contracted by the RNA before or during the Royal Queensland Show.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

You can be assured that the privacy of your personal information is of the utmost importance to us. The information provided by you in any application for membership or application to enter is used by the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (RNA) to offer member services or to organise and conduct competitions at the Royal Queensland Show. By applying for membership or entering such competitions you consent to provide such details as your name, address and exhibit details. Competition information may be made available to the media and included in RNA publications.

Your information will not be disclosed without your consent for any other purpose unless required by the law. ENTRY FORMS

Exhibitors must complete "STATEMENT BY EXHIBITOR" section on the front page of the entry form advising their taxation status.

PRIZE MONEY

1. Prize Money stated in the Schedule excludes GST.
2. GST will be added to the Prize Money for Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes. Prize money will be paid into your nominated bank account by 31 October following the Show.
3. The Association will provide a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.
4. All cash prizes and trophies must be claimed within six months from the closing date of the Royal Queensland Show. Prizes not claimed and by that date will be considered to have lapsed, and the amount will become a donation to the Association. (RNA By-Laws)

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

1. The Brisbane Showgrounds are a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the RNA holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor of any area of the Showgrounds.
2. Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, RNA staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.
3. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.
4. Exhibits will only be held and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the exhibitor/competitor.
5. A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to and policed by exhibitors/competitors and exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in the pavilions.
6. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.
7. All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of noncompliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Royal Queensland Show.
8. The Brisbane Showgrounds is subject to a Special Facility License issued under the Liquor Act 1992 and strict laws related to the consumption and possession of liquor across the Brisbane Showgrounds site. The consumption or possession of liquor outside of the licensed bar areas is not authorised by the RNA and in many cases may be an offence for which on the spot fines can be issued by Police and Liquor Licensing Investigators.

DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

132. It there is any inconsistency between By-laws 133 - 153 and any other By-laws of the Association, By-laws 133 - 153 will prevail.
133. The functions of the Disciplinary Committee shall be to hear and determine all complaints, allegations and other matters relating to:
- a) prohibited substances, as defined in these By-laws or Sectional Regulations.
 - b) any alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association by an exhibitor and relating to an exhibit or to a competition, except if the alleged breach is of a kind that the Chairman of a Sectional Committee considers is of a less serious nature and should properly be dealt with by the Sectional Committee, and
 - c) any other alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association that may be referred to Disciplinary Committee pursuant to By-Law 137 (a).
147. The Disciplinary Committee may announce its decision orally or in writing. A decision that is announced orally shall have effect in accordance with its terms.
148. If the opinion of the Disciplinary Committee is not unanimous, the decision of the majority shall prevail. If the Disciplinary Committee are equally divided on any question concerning the guilt or innocence of a person, the question shall be resolved in that person's favour.
149. If the Disciplinary Committee considers that there has been a breach of the rules, By-laws or regulations of the Association, it may impose such a penalty as it considers to be appropriate, including without limitation:
- a. a reprimand;
 - b. a monetary fine (payable at such time/s as the Disciplinary Committee may determine);
 - c. withdrawal or withholding of any award or ribbon;
 - d. disqualification in respect of any class;
 - e. expulsion from the Showground;
 - f. where the person concerned is a member, a suspension or termination of that membership;
 - g. a ban;
 - h. exclusion;
 - i. prohibiting a Person from exhibiting or competing at the current Show or at any future Show;
 - j. a direction that an Exhibit be removed from the Showground;
 - k. any other mandatory requirement; and
 - l. any other penalty provided for in other regulations of the Association.
150. There shall be no appeal from any decision of the Disciplinary Committee.

INSURANCE

161. The RNA may (but is not obliged to) take out a policy of insurance in respect of the legal liability on the part of an Exhibitor for loss or damage suffered by a third party caused by any act or omission of an Exhibit or the Exhibitor.
162. The RNA, RNA Staff Members and Officials of the RNA are not liable to any Exhibitor if the RNA fails to take out a policy of insurance effectively protecting any Exhibitor or Exhibit, or if any such policy does not operate to indemnify the Exhibitor in respect of the loss or damage in question.

REGULATIONS & BY-LAWS

All Entries and Exhibitors are subject to RNA Regulations and By- Laws set out in this schedule as well as other By-Laws that may pertain to this competition

Full copies of the RNA By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Competitions Department.

FASHIONS ON THE FIELD REGULATIONS

Once a contestant has participated in the heats of the Ekka Fashions on the Field competition, the contestant is not permitted to make any alterations or add or remove any of the garments for later rounds and/ or final of the same competition, otherwise they will be disqualified from the competition.

Contestants who fail to appear for their competition at the correct time will be disqualified from the competition.

The Promoter will select the judging panel and each validly entered contestant will be judged based on the Judging Criteria (as interpreted by the judges in their absolute discretion). The judges' decision is final. In the event of a draw, the Promoter's Adjudicator, The Ringmaster or delegated RNA Councilor, will determine the winner.

Entry may be refused if a contestant does not meet one or more of the Judging Criteria or the eligibility criteria or breaches these terms and conditions. Contestants are required to take full responsibility for their entry and for ensuring that their entry complies with these terms and conditions. Incomplete and illegible entries will be deemed invalid.

If an entry is invalid or if a contestant is unable or refuses to take part in any element of this Promotion, the Promoters reserve the right to discard that contestant's entry and proceed as if that contestant had not entered the Promotion.

If for any reason after a contestant has won a Prize, and the Promoters become aware that the contestant has not complied with the terms and conditions or that their entry is otherwise invalid, that contestant will have no entitlement to the Prize, even if the Promoters have announced them as a winner and that contestant will be required, at the direction of the Promoters, to return, refund or otherwise make restitution of the Prize.

Contestants agree that their image, name, character, likeness, voice or anything else that identifies them for the purposes of any promotion or matter incidental to the Promotion, including future similar promotions, and at any time during or after the Promotional Period and via any means (including but not limited to, any national print media, the Promoter's website and any other promotional material) may be used by the Promoters, and the Promoters' sponsors for future promotional and publicity purposes without any compensation or reward.

Should a winner prove to be ineligible for a competition, be unable to fulfil the Contestant Criteria in any way, breach these terms or interfere with the fair running of the competition (or attempt to do so), then some or all of their prizes may be passed on to the contestant with the next highest score in the Final. If that contestant similarly fails to qualify for a prize, then the prize will be transferred to the contestant with the next highest score in the Final and so on.

All entrants must comply to the by-laws of the The Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (RNA)

Eligibility:

Contestants must be 15 years of age or over on the day of the judging of the event. Proof of age may need to be provided at the time of registration.

Employees, directors and other representatives of the Promoter (Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland) and organizations involved in the sponsorship or judging of the event are ineligible, as are members of their immediate families and households.

Non Commercial Involvement:

Neither contestants nor their outfits are permitted to commercially promote a brand, store, or designer.

Contestants may not enter the competition on behalf of a third party, nor receive any payment or benefit from a third party for entering (or otherwise in connection with) the Promoters, Sponsors or Judges of the event.

How to Enter:

It is preferred that entries be made online, in advance, via the Royal Queensland Show Competitions webpage.

- Competitors will pay for their entry into the grounds through the application form.
- Competitors who wish to enter the competition in person on the day must seek their own entry into the grounds.

Contestants may enter up to 2 classes in the competition (in which they are eligible), provided they meet the described criteria for each class.

Judging Criteria:

Class 1: Best Dressed Steward (Unisex)

- Open to male and female volunteer Stewards and Honorary Council Stewards of the Royal Queensland Show 2019.
- Stewards should abide by a standard of dress which upholds the traditions of the show and maintains a professional presentation.
- Ideal ensembles should be functional and practical for a day's stewarding in their relevant section.
- Stewards who are required to wear a traditional 'dustcoat' for their daily duties may remove them for the purposes of the competition.
- Female Stewards should consider a tailored type dress, suit, slack suit and/ or jacket, hat and suitable footwear.
- Male Stewards should consider a lounge suit, tailored slacks, dress moleskins, sports coat/ jacket, tie, hat and suitable footwear.
- Tracksuit pants, jeans, joggers, open toed shoes, and baseball caps are all prohibited and entries will be automatically disqualified.
- The contestants will be appraised for their personal grooming, deportment, suitability of their ensemble and their personal style.

Class 2: Best Dressed Lady (18 – 40 years)

- Outfit to be of classic race wear style for the Spring Season.
- The style, originality and suitability of the outfit should be appropriate for a lady attending a Metropolitan Race Meeting during the Spring Racing Carnival.
- Skirt length should not be above the knees, narrow shoulder straps and strapless bodices are strongly discouraged.
- Attention to detail will be appraised for accessories, shoes, bag & millinery.
- Millinery is compulsory and should be appropriate for the spring season.
- A demonstration of an understanding and interpretation of the current race wear fashion trends will be looked upon favourably.
 - Elements of the outfit should reflect current trends without losing the contestant's personal flair.
- The contestant will be appraised for grooming and deportment.

Class 3: Best Dressed Lady (40 years and over)

- Outfit to be of classic race wear style for the Spring Season.
- The style, originality and suitability of the outfit should be appropriate for a mature lady attending a Metropolitan Race Meeting during the Spring Racing Carnival.
- Skirt length should not be above the knees, narrow shoulder straps and strapless bodices are strongly discouraged.
- Attention to detail will be appraised for accessories, shoes, bag & millinery.
- Millinery is compulsory and should be appropriate for the spring season.
- A demonstration of an understanding and interpretation of the current race wear fashion trends will be looked upon favourably.
 - Elements of the outfit should reflect current trends without losing the contestant's personal flair.
- The contestant will be appraised for grooming and deportment.

Class 4: Best Dressed Gentleman (18 years and over)

- Outfit should be of classic race wear for the Spring Season.
- The style, originality and suitability of the outfit should be appropriate for a gentleman attending a Metropolitan Race Meeting during the Spring Racing Carnival.
- Contestants must wear a suit and tie (or alternative neckwear).
- A demonstration of an understanding and interpretation of the current gentleman's race wear fashion trends will be looked upon favourably.
 - Elements of the outfit should reflect current trends without losing the contestant's personal flair.
- A gentleman's hat is not compulsory but will be looked upon favourably.
- The contestant will be appraised for grooming and deportment and attention to detail.

Class 5: Best Headwear (Unisex)

- The Millinery will be appraised for:
 - Originality
 - Concept of design theme
 - Quality and workmanship
 - Wearability
- The Millinery should be coordinated with the outfit worn.
- The contestant will be appraised for grooming and deportment and attention to detail.
- To be eligible for this category, a headpiece is **COMPULSORY**.

Class 6: Best Dressed Junior (Unisex, 15-17 years)

- Outfit to be age appropriate in line with classic race wear style for the Spring Season.
- For girls, skirt length should not be above the knees, narrow shoulder straps and strapless bodices are strongly discouraged. Millinery is compulsory and should be appropriate for the spring season.
- Boys must wear a suit and tie (or alternative neckwear).
- Attention to detail will be appraised for accessories, shoes, bag & millinery.
- Elements of the outfit should reflect current trends without losing the contestant's personal flair.
- The contestant will be appraised for grooming and deportment.
- All entrants under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Contestants Please Note:

- Weather conditions in Brisbane during August are often unpredictable.
- In the event of cool or inclement weather, contestants are permitted to style their outfits for the Winter season.
- In this instance both Spring and Winter season outfits will be judged equally.
- Please ensure that your chosen accessories, millinery and gentlemen's hats match your seasonal choice. Ladies should consider hosiery to add the finishing touch to their Winter season outfit.
- Attention should be paid to selecting suitable footwear for the event.
 - Differing surfaces will be encountered by contestants during the event including, grass, dirt, concrete and steps.
