



Welcome from the President



Our competitions are the backbone of the Royal Queensland Show (Ekka), bringing the city and country together each year to showcase the best of the best.

In 2023 the 144th Ekka was the most attended Show since 2019, since before the Covid-19 pandemic. Queensland's biggest and most loved event was an incredible success, attracting around 400,000 people.

We were delighted to once again reward and recognise our exhibitors across 54 competition sections. The RNA received over 20,000 competition entries, a 12% increase on 2022, which is also back to pre-pandemic levels.

More than 4,400 exhibitors travelled from across the country for their chance to win a coveted blue ribbon when the Ekka awards and celebrates the best of the best.

The entries included 4,257 prized animals, 1,231 cakes and condiments and 634 works by Queensland students.

Our competitors were able to share in a total prize pool of almost \$680,000 – a 10% increase on last year.

In 2023 we hosted 10 international judges, ensuring exhibits were judged by some of the world's most highly experienced and respected individuals.

In 2024, the nine-day Show will be held from Saturday 10 August to Sunday 18 August, running over two full weekends.

Since 1875, the RNA has been dedicated to championing agriculture and is honoured to stage Queensland's largest event on behalf of the community each year.

We look forward to continuing this wonderful legacy for future generations of exhibitors and patrons to enjoy.

G.O.A.T COMPETITION

The G.O.A.T. (Greatest Of All Time) Competition provides a fun and interactive way for students to learn about food and fibre production through use of the curriculum-linked Australian Good Meat Education resources, while also exploring what makes their local region - showcasing why it is the 'greatest of all time.'

Students are to use the template provided to create a design that celebrates their local region showcasing why it is the greatest of all time.

Each student will have the opportunity to submit one design. Entries will be judged with 19 finalists selected to receive a life-sized, fibreglass goat (7kg) to display their design. Specifically, the student – with the help of their classmates – will replicate their submitted entry by painting it onto the goat. The 19 goat finalists will be representative of the 19 goats that arrived in Australia on the first fleet back in 1788.

All 19 painted goats remain the property of the RNA and will be returned to the RNA Showgrounds for display at this year's Ekka.

Students can take inspiration from their family, school, town or local agricultural industry to influence their design. The design must be accompanied with a 20-100 word explanation to support their artistic direction.

All nineteen finalists will be sent with a \$50.00 deposit via bank transfer to the nominated bank account to purchase varnish to seal the painting.

All nineteen painted goats remain the property of the RNA and will be returned to the RNA Showgrounds to be displayed at this years Ekka.

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

First Round

Design submission will be open to students from years P-6. Maximum of one entry per student. Students are to use the template provided to design their concept.

Second Round

The top 19 student designs will be selected to decorate a fibreglass goat which will be sent to the school, bringing their design to life and go into the running for placement. All goats will be on display for the 2024 Ekka.

First: \$500.00 Prize, Virtual "Meet a Goat Farmer" Experience,

Goat Product Hamper, Trophy, & Sash. **Second:** \$300.00 Prize, Trophy, & Sash. **Third:** \$200.00 Prize, Trophy, & Sash.

G.O.A.T COMPETITION REGULATIONS

- 1. No entry fee.
- 2. Students may submit one drawing design each of the downloaded goat picture.
- 3. Submission must be uploaded through the Ekka exhibitor portal.
- 4. Drawing designs may be displayed at the Royal Queensland Show 10 18 August 2024. Winning exhibitors will be contacted by the Competition Coordinator.
- 5. Finalists will receive one of nineteen life-size (7kg) goats delivered to their school from the 20th May 2024. All goats must be decorated as per their original winning design and repackaged in the original packaging to be picked up, by Friday 26th July 2024 by 9.00am for delivery to the Loading Dock, Royal International Convention Centre, 600 Gregory Terrace, Bowen Hills, QLD 4006. Please include the school, class, and student's name on the package label.
- 6. Winners' names will be listed on the Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) website www.ekka.com.au.
- 7. All goat entries must be designed by students and the finalists' design must be painted by the class.
- 8. No more than one design per school will be selected as a finalist.
- 9. Goats must be painted with non-toxic paint and sealed with varnish. A \$50.00 deposit via bank transfer to the nominated bank account will be supplied to purchase varnish to seal the artwork.
- Entry into this competition does not permit an exhibitor free entry into the Showgrounds during the Royal Queensland Show.





DIAGRAM OF LIFE SIZE FIBREGLASS GOAT

Judging will be performed by a panel of Judges appointed by the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland.
