# Beefing up carcass performance in the Ekka's Paddock to Palate Competition

Entries are now open for the 2026 RNA Paddock to Palate Competition presented by JBS Australia, with extended feed days designed to strengthen carcass performance and better meet evolving market demands.

Offering almost \$55,000 in prize money, the prestigious competition allows beef producers to benchmark their cattle using cutting-edge data collection technology, helping drive genetic improvement and commercial performance across the industry.

In 2026, the days on feed have increased for all classes - Classes 37 and 40 from 100 to 120 days, and Class 38 from 70 to 100 days.

RNA Beef Committee Chair Gary Noller said the change would help further enhance carcass quality and deliver stronger outcomes for consumers.

"The extra time on feed is a consumer-driven change – it gives the cattle more opportunity to achieve the marbling and fat cover needed to meet market specifications," Mr Noller said.

"That improved carcass quality ultimately benefits the consumer through a better end product."

The Paddock to Palate Competition is the only beef competition in Australia that produces a commercial brand - the JBS Royal 100.

Now in its 29th year, the competition continues to go from strength to strength, attracting 1,085 head of cattle in 2025, an increase of 35 per cent on 2024.

"The competition gives exhibitors the opportunity to see how their cattle perform in a commercial environment and benchmark their results against some of the best in the industry," Mr Noller said.

"The respect, reputation and integrity around the competition and the data we provide back to exhibitors is second to none.

"The data comparison allows exhibitors to validate and refine their genetic selection, helping shape the future direction of their breeding programs and strengthening their connection to the consumer."

The competition features three phases - best aggregate weight gain, held at the JBS Beef City feedlot west of Toowoomba, followed by a carcass competition and an MSA eating quality competition.

The exhibitors achieving the highest combined scores across all three phases in each class will take out top honours at the Paddock to Palate Awards and Beef Industry Dinner during Ekka Beef Week 2026.
