It's Showtime! Ekka's back in town

Brisbane's beloved Royal Queensland Show (Ekka) presented by the Bank of Queensland (BOQ), opens tomorrow (August 9) marking the start of nine days of celebration, agriculture, entertainment, and community spirit, with 400,000 people expected to come through the gates.

To celebrate the final countdown, Ekka tickets have been discounted by 20% until midnight tonight (Friday 8 August). Subscribers can also purchase tickets for a Super Saver Day (Monday 11 August, Tuesday 12 August, Thursday 14 August and Friday 15 August), which are 20% cheaper.

For the first time since 2022, visitors will be able to arrive directly at the Brisbane Showgrounds via train, thanks to the newly completed Exhibition Station—hailed as a game changer for accessibility and convenience.

RNA Chief Executive Brendan Christou said about 400,000 people from rural towns and cities across Queensland and beyond were expected to flock to this year's Ekka to learn about agriculture, share stories, and be delighted by 21,000 competition entries and 10,000 animals.

"The Ekka is the People's Show, and this year's Ekka offers unbeatable value with four Super Saver Days, discounted ride and food offers, and cheap train travel with 50 cent fares," Mr Christou said.

"We are very aware of rising cost of living pressures and have worked hard to introduce a variety of cost-saving measures, making the Show affordable for all."

The Ekka's special Super Saver Days – Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday – are back, which are 20% cheaper (off entry price) than weekends and the public holiday.

For the first time, Ekka food outlets will feature family bundles starting from \$12 to feed a family of four, while more than 110 Show vendors will offer a value food item priced at \$10 or less.

The popular daily two-for-one rides session will be back, giving visitors one hour of discounted rides from 9.30am to 10.30am every morning of Ekka in the B105 Sideshow Alley and Kids Carnival area.

Rounding out the savings on offer at Ekka this year will be the 50 cent train fares to the new Exhibition Station located in the Brisbane Showgrounds.

Visitors to the 2025 Ekka will also enjoy new daytime entertainment including Melville's Duck Racing, Smurfs – The Lost Village Live Show, and Circus Firemen.







Plus learn about the agricultural industry at the new Strawberry Sundae Lane presented by Bank of Queensland (BOQ), the Wool Workshop presented by Toy Farm, and the interactive Cluck and Collect display.

As the sun sets, the new night show EkkaNITES Inferno will light up the Main Arena with its tribute to the outback featuring bold and bright entertainment, heart racing action and a breathtaking fireworks display.

Mr Christou said the Ekka is an incredible Queensland institution which unites city and country.

"Its rich heritage, beloved traditions and diverse competitions form an integral part of the state's cultural and social fabric. We can't wait to welcome visitors through the gates from 8.30am tomorrow," he said.
